have been exploring much more sensory play within the Lambs Room and have introduced a sensory only area in the sleep room that the children can access throughout the play sessions.

We have been learning about our local community – specifically concentrating on what we see around the nursery. Have a look at our display boards in the room to see the different land marks we could find and have visited.



<u>Farmers</u> – In the Farmers Room the children have been exploring traditional stories



such as 'Goldilocks & the Three Bears' and 'The Three Little Pigs'. Activities have included being creative, role playing and re-enacting the story, creating their own structures, getting messy in mud, porridge and straw and exploring a range of emotions.

We would all like to give all our parent/carers a huge welcome to Fisherfield Childcare, Bury College. September is a busy month with many children joining us for the first time and settling in can take some time. 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Here are just a few things you can do to help:

Bring something from home to support your child in feeling reassured, such as a comforter (blanket, teddy, familiar story book from home); ensure you have shared everything you possibly can with a staff member throughout the settling in sessions, induction period and of any changes on a daily basis – small changes at home can make a significant difference to how your child feels; lastly be honest and consistent with your child.



Preparing your child in coming to nursery is a positive thing and reassuring them that you will be back after lunch/tea. Also, attendance, routine and regular drop off/collection times support your child in getting used to their new nursery day.



Any other information:

- Have you got a nursery pass? If you use the main college entrance to get into nursery then the college security will require parent/carers to show a nursery pass. This is for maximum security. Please ensure you show the college team your pass if you're walking or leave it on your dash board if you drive in. Speak to a member of the Fisherfield team if you require one.
- New nursery entrance/side gate. Have you seen the new entrance to the nursery premises? You can access this from Parliament Street, South Bank Road and Westminster Street which is just off Manchester Road. Just park up safely, press the button and wait for a member of the Fisherfield Team to identify you and let you through.
- Pram store. Please can I remind parent/carers to collapse their child's pram before parking it in the pram store.
- 30-hour funding. If your child is eligible for the 30-hour funding then please remember to **renew your code every 3 months**. You should get a new date each time you log in to renew.
- Are you logged in to iConnect? If you are having difficulties please speak to a member of the Fisherfield Team in your child's room.
