Did you know: Sensory play encourages children to problem solve using their five senses? By stimulating your child's senses you are helping their brain to develop because when a sense is engaged neural pathways are created to assist with further learning in later years.



Ducklings



The Ducklings team have been focusing on loose parts play and the introduction of open-ended resources and as a result, have recently transformed their small world and construction areas. Previously, you may have seen lots of brightly coloured plastic toys in our areas, such as toy cars or Duplo. A toy car can only ever be a toy car therefore we have introduced new resources for example: cardboard tubes, curtain hoops, bamboo sticks etc. that can be made into anything we want! As there is no right or wrong way of using open ended resources, this can help build children's imagination and self-esteem.

We have introduced home learning bags to be used on an Autumn walk and it has been heart-warming to see the children's excitement as they return to nursery with their bags of Autumnal treasure!
