We had a very special visitor - Bobby the Bunny which is Ellie's new baby rabbit. The children adored feeding her and stroking her gently, therefore showing care and concern for living things.



We will be focusing on maths and promoting numbers, shape, space and measure through lots of problem solving. We have recently sent home learning bags to support our topic. Please spend some time filling out the sheets with your child, take photographs and share them with nursery.



Farmers:

The Farmers have been learning about recycling following on from one of the children's interests. Our friend helps to litter pick at the local park. They have enjoyed filling their home learning bags with recycling from home and sorting them into the correct baskets back at nursery. The children have helped to create two displays focussed on recycling, linking to our new stories about animals being endangered from plastic and waste.

The last few months of the academic year will see a great focus on those children leaving to go to school, ensuring they are prepared for their move. Our main areas are: building independence and emotional resilience whilst also focusing on maths and phonic skills. We will also be taking part in weekly P.E and yoga sessions. Teachers from local schools have been invited into our setting to meet the children and key workers will be completing transition packs to support effective information sharing.

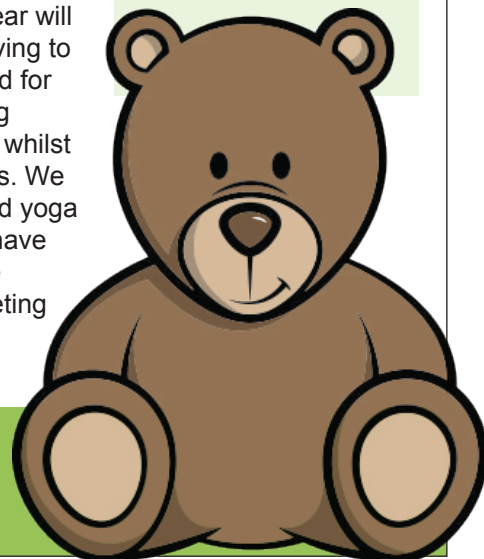
