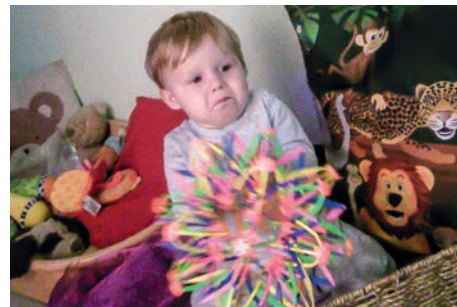


Across the setting following some training we have begun mindfulness sessions with our children. The children are encouraged to follow 7 simple steps, and this helps the children to have quiet time and reflect on their emotions even from a young age. The children have really enjoyed the sessions and have been so calm afterwards, some children fall asleep and others are still becoming familiar with it which is just fine too. We have new resources such as an aromatherapy diffuser, and resources for us to develop our breathing such as bubbles, and feathers. This helps children to deal with their emotions and become resilient to new situations and manage them effectively.



Lambs:

The children in Lambs are all settling very well. They have enjoyed getting to know one another and welcoming lots of new friends into our nursery. The Lambs have been experiencing lots of new sensory play activities, learning all about each other and their families and taking part in lots of calm time. The children have enjoyed the mindfulness sessions blowing the bubbles, listening to calming music and baby massage.

The Lambs have also been focusing on stories as part of our literacy project. The children have helped to choose stories to read and have been reading them each day to help them get more familiar with specific words and everyday objects. These books will also be shared with you to take home.

Farmers:

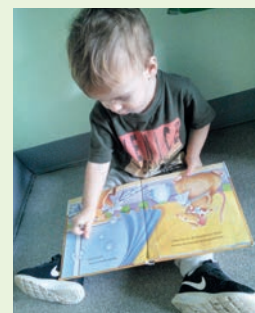
