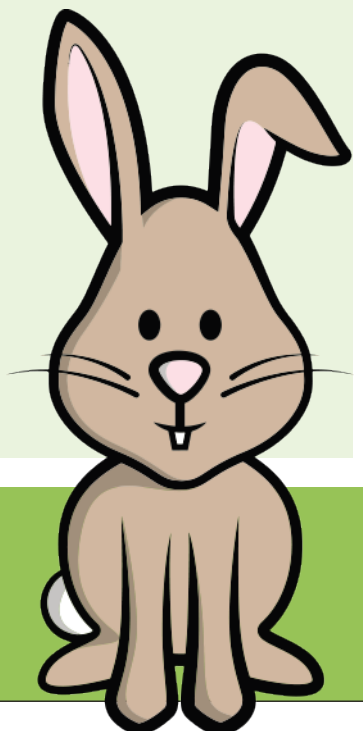

The children saw a squirrel and when they arrived back at nursery they were very excited and inspired to paint a picture of this and discuss what they had seen.

The Ducks have also been focusing on their emotions and joining in with daily calming down activities, following training we attended on emotional resilience. We created a calm down area in the room where the children can explore the sensory boxes, listen to music, have yoga sessions and take part in deep breathing activities.

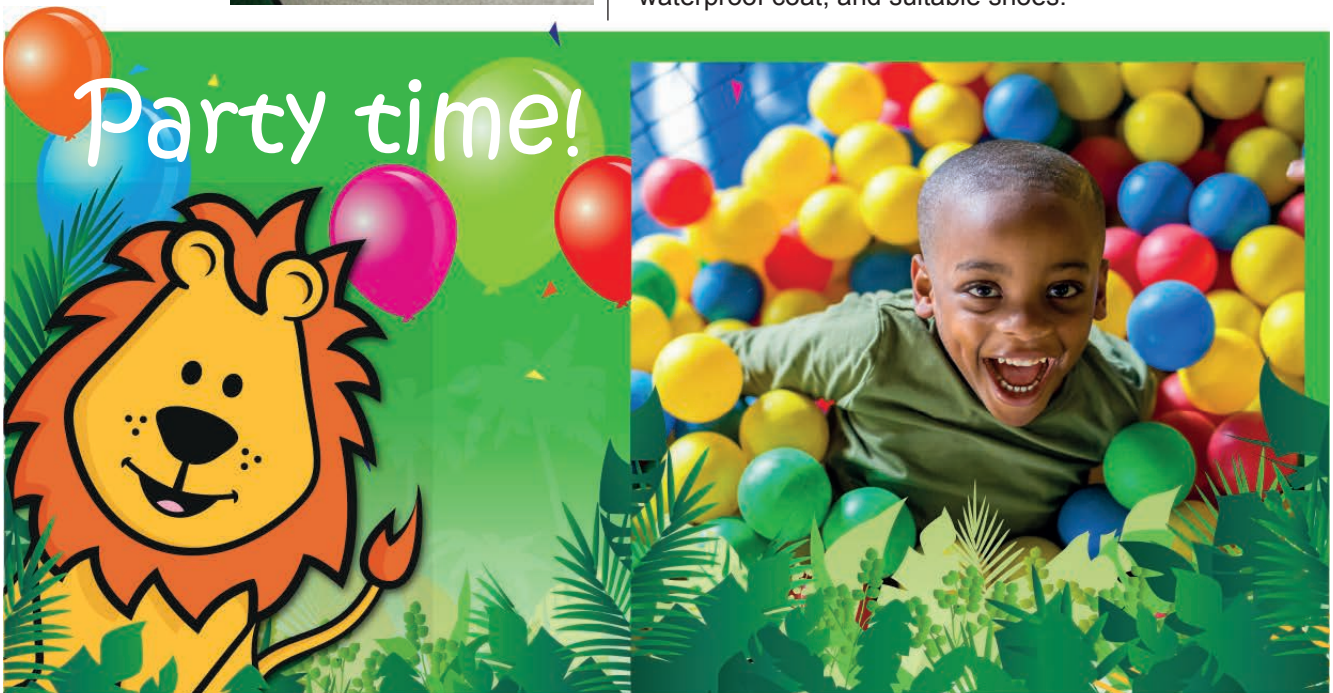


Thank You!
