Lambs

In the Lambs bubble, the children have enjoyed a senses topic which stemmed from the children's interests in the different textures in the outdoor area. The children enjoyed crunching the leaves and listening to environmental sounds like the variety of birds that live in the trees around us. The staff followed this interest and planned activities such as food play in the home corner, the children enjoyed smelling a variety of food items like limes, onions, carrots etc. The children also enjoyed using sensory playdough which helped to build their fine and gross motor skills, strengthening the muscles and joints in their hands ready for mark-making. The children also took part in a baking activity where they made some buns to take home and enjoy! The children are now exploring some of their favourite stories; please feel free to share their favourite stories with us and pictures from story time at home.

Ducks and Farmers

The Ducks and Farmers have certainly been busy since returning to nursery!





In Bubble 2, the children showed a keen interest in fireworks after reading "Peppa Pig's Diwali" and being fascinated by the illustrations. To develop this interest and take the children on a learning journey, we took part in a variety of science experiments. During one, we filled a balloon with different coloured paint and popped it to create a unique splatter painting that looked like a firework! We made predictions before the big 'pop' about what colour we thought would come out of the balloon. Thank you to the parents for their activity suggestions. Seb's mum shared a great idea for another experiment involving blowing up balloons and watching them deflate and move around like fireworks, and Alice and her mum created their own sparkly fireworks at home using pipe cleaners! Following on from this, our friend Benjamin brought a potato into nursery which sparked an interest in vegetables and different foods. We used potatoes to create potato print pictures and even made some food of our own. We made some tiger bread after reading "The Tiger who Came to Tea", the children reported back that it tasted grrrreat!

In Bubble 3, the Ducks and Farmers have been fascinated by the changes to the weather outside as they spend their outdoor play listening to the crunchy leaves that have fallen from the trees surrounding the play area. The staff capitalised on this interest and used it as a springboard to learn about the different weathers and what causes them. Following this, the children used natural materials they found outside to create 'Nature Crowns' which they wore home. The staff have also been focusing on school readiness as they used this as an opportunity to plan some early phonic skill activities involving identifying environmental sounds. The children went on an environmental sound hunt and heard different sounds such as the wind, leaves crunching and birds singing. As Autumn arrives, it brings with it a change in weather and also a variety of different autumnal colours in the natural surroundings. This was the influence for their most recent topic which is 'Colour' where the children will be learning about colour mixing.
