LAMBS

We have introduced a sensory morning to our routine where the children can relax and use all their senses to explore. We have explored paint, bubblewrap and mindfulness techniques. In the coming month parents will be invited to join a session with their child.



EXPLORERS

The children have shown an interest in number play. We displayed a number line and the children are excited to see which number has been blown away by the wind each morning. The children then hunt the number and carry out activities such as categorising linking to the number that blew away.



FARMERS

We have carried lots of activities linking to the Leaf Man story. The children brought in leaves, conkers and sticks from home which we used to freeze and paint with, they were also excited when they found slugs and ladybirds had also travelled into the nursery. The children went on leaf hunts outside and create their own animals from the story.

DUCKS

The Duckling's have wanted to learn through nature play, they have enjoyed painting with mud and sticks, freezing natural objects and taking part in lots of risky play such as climbing the slide outside, walking on crates and balancing on beams.

Sunday 10th October 2021

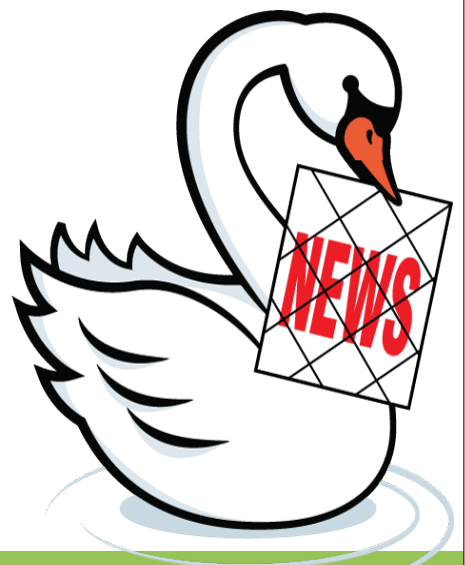
