The children have enjoyed using their different senses, especially their sense of touch as they have felt the different textures and sensations during play as they explored materials that replicate snow such as cotton wool, flour, and ice. The little lambs have been exploring the changes of their outdoor environment and spotting the different wildlife animals that are out in the winter. We then created our own winter houses to keep the animals warm during



wintertime. We have also introduced bubble babies to the lamb's room, which the children have really enjoyed as they have been splashing in the water and singing along to their favourite nursery rhymes.
