LOOK WHAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING...

In Little Lambs this month, we have been focusing on introducing numbers through songs and rhymes. The children have also spent lots of time in the sunshine enjoying ball games that help develop their coordination skills through kicking, catching, and throwing.

In the Ducklings room, with the warm weather, the children have loved exploring the outdoor area. They have been learning about different mini-beasts and sea animals through the book *What the Ladybird Heard at the Seaside*. The children discovered where different bugs live and what they eat. They also spent time creating their own ice cream shop, taking turns role-playing as customers and shopkeepers.

The Farmer's children have been learning all about kindness and sharing. We have been talking with them about their emotions, discussing what makes us happy or sad. This was linked to their feelings about moving on to school. We explored how school will be different from nursery but also very exciting. We will continue these activities over the next few weeks.
