We hope you all had a great Easter break, and thank you to everyone who got involved in our Easter events – all our children have been very busy, take a look at what exciting things they've been up to.

<u>Little Lambs – Topic Healthy Eating</u> - Thank you to parents that have shared photos of their meal

times at home - we created a lovely display to see what yummy foods you eat with your families, which then led to us looking at the topic of 'Healthy Eating'.

Take a look at the display within the Lambs room that you shared with us over the ParentZone app. The children really enjoyed looking at pictures of themselves displayed on the board! We love to get messy whilst creating bright fruit and vegetable pictures using real fruit & veg.

Little Lambs have been making a 'Calm Box'. This is a recent idea from staff training sessions about resilience and managing behaviour. We put together materials to start our 'calm box', feathers, bubbles, playdough, cotton wool, sensory lights and a textured ball which you can squeeze. This helps the children to transition from a play session to meal times or sleep times and encourages them to be gentle with the resources.

In Lambs we will soon be planting in our garden. We've started already by exploring the mud and soil and pulling out any weeds. We have freshened up our displays and are excited to develop the areas with plants, seeds and herbs. Let's see what we can grow!

<u>Ducklings – Getting Creative</u> - Ducklings have taken part in lots of lovely Easter activities such as an Easter bonnet competition! Children and parents got involved and worked really hard to decorate an Easter bonnet.



A big well done to Edward Seed for winning in the Duckling's room, and a massive THANK YOU to all children and parents who took part. They all looked amazing!

We had a visit from the paramedics who were eager to talk to the children about the important job they do through the day and night. The children enjoyed talking to them and were excited to explore the ambulances and equipment.
